# **Term Four Learning**

# **Concept**: Identity

Big Understanding: Identity is shaped by relationships, connections and / or the environment

In Term Four, our focus will shift to exploring the values of our school, integrated through digital technology. Students will use a variety of digital tools to creatively express their understanding of our core values, such as respect, responsibility, and excellence. This approach will not only enhance their digital literacy but also deepen their connection to the values that guide our school community. By leveraging technology, students will be able to share their reflections in innovative ways, fostering a greater appreciation for how these values shape their actions and interactions, both within the school and in the wider world

### **Mathematics:**

This term, the Mathematics focus for the first five weeks will centre on developing students' understanding of ratios, proportions, percentages, and fractions. Through engaging activities and problem-solving, students will learn how to apply these concepts in real-life scenarios. For the remainder of the term, the focus will shift to the three major strands of Measurement, Geometry, and Statistics. Students will explore concepts such as time, area, volume, shapes, spatial reasoning, and data interpretation, building a solid foundation across these essential mathematical areas.

## Writing:

This term, our students will focus on narrative writing with an emphasis on expanding their vocabulary, including adjectives, verbs, adverbs, nouns, and subject-specific terms. They will learn to use rich, precise language to create vivid imagery and evoke emotions in their stories.

To enhance their writing, we will introduce literary devices such as metaphors and personification, helping students bring their narratives to life. Through this, they will craft more engaging, dynamic stories that capture readers' imaginations and leave lasting impressions.

# Reading:

In Term 4, we will continue focusing on novel studies, with teachers reading a novel of their choice to their classes, emphasising the unpacking of unfamiliar vocabulary. Our Level 4 and 5 learners will concentrate on novel studies, engaging in deeper discussions to develop their skills in questioning, prediction, inference–making, and drawing conclusions. Meanwhile, our Level 2 and 3 learners will be exposed to short texts from School Journals, focusing on building fluency, decoding skills, and comprehension strategies to help them better understand shorter, more accessible texts.

### **P.E.:**

Throughout this term, students will dedicate their efforts to enhancing their skills in various athletic disciplines. This will involve refining techniques in sprints, relays, high jump, long jump, discus, and shot put. They will then apply these newly acquired abilities in real-life settings, particularly during their involvement in athletic events. Additionally, students will be introduced to and instructed in the fundamentals of each discipline, ensuring they develop a strong foundation in the key skills necessary for success in athletics.
