Reminders

Hats:

In Term 4 all Tipu students require a <u>named</u> red school bucket hat for outside play.

Learning Focus

Conceptual Curriculum 2024:

'Identity is shaped by relationships, connections and environment.'

Having explored how dance and music can support our understanding of identity during Term 3, during Term 4 we will be looking at how people can hold different **perspectives** on the world and how we can listen to the views and thoughts of others. We are exploring our sense of empathy and how we can recognise emotions in ourselves and our friends through the **Social Sciences** curriculum.

Later in the term we aim to explore the **Technology** curriculum through the design process, using what we have learnt about recognising the emotions of others to create and refine play experiences and games for our peers and children joining our school from early childhood centres.

Literacu:

We continue to develop our understanding of language through the Little Learners Love Literacy programme. This structured approach teaches new sounds through different stages and uses these sounds to build words in Reading and Writing. Our school library is also open from 3.15pm - 4.00pm each Wednesday for families to borrow books to support a love of reading at home.

Mathematics:

We continue to develop early number knowledge, particularly focussed between 0-20, and the skills to solve basic mathematical problem.

Physical Education:

This term our classes will continue to participate in lessons from the Perceptual Motor Programme (PMP), focusing on building coordination, skills and reflexes important for early learning. We are supporting this with sessions on fundamental movement skills with Counties Manukau sport, and our gymnastics sessions later in the term.
