Kia ora Whanake Whaanau,

We hope everyone has been enjoying the first couple of months of the year as we wrap up the amazing New Zealand Summer.

Students have been busy the last couple of weeks, ensuring they are confident with the routines and expectations within their classrooms and school, taking part in challenges that build their social skills and getting to know their peers and teachers.

From this week, the explicit teaching begins and students will start working in their Reading, Writing and Maths groups.

For Reading this term, the main focus is based around decoding and reading comprehension strategies such as inferencing and making connections. This will ultimately develop confidence in reading overall.

The focus for Writing is going to be creating a narrative piece of text. This lends itself well to building vocabulary knowledge and using descriptive language that will enhance their ability to craft a piece of text. Our Maths focus is addition and subtraction. A variety of strategies will be taught while simultaneously using problem solving skills. This allows students to link their maths learning with real-life scenarios and in turn makes the learning more meaningful.

The Conceptual idea this year is 'Change occurs in different ways that may initiate reactions, opportunities and / or challenges.' The goal is to develop learners who have an understanding that change is a constant in life and it's how we respond to this change that determines our results.

We are looking forward to our at-school camp in Week 9 of this term. More details about this event and the parent information evening will be provided in due course.

We are so excited about teaching your tamariki this year and can't wait to get to know all of our students and whaanau.
